The International Wildlife Rehabilitation Council will offer a Pain & Wound Management course in Oconomowoc, WI this coming November for those looking to add to their formal wildlife rehabilitation education. The IWRC is a non-profit organization that offers training and support to professional wildlife rehabilitators - from large non-profit organizations to individual home rehabilitators.

Course Description:

Pain Management is designed to give wildlife care professionals a working knowledge of the vocabulary and concepts underlying the modern approach to pain management in mammalian and avian species. Topics include the physiology and clinical signs of pain, supportive care techniques, and drug therapy including indications, contraindications and side effects. Wound Management provides a systematic review of the physiology and treatment of the most common types of soft-tissue wounds seen in injured mammalian and avian species. Topics include wound assessment, wound types, antibiotic therapy, cleaning and topical agents, bandaging techniques and the physiology and stages of wound healing. Fractures and wound management in herpetiles are not covered in this course. Lab included. 10 CE Units.
